Executive Committee

Fundraising presentation by Mike and Kristi Stokey

- Tumbler
 - 16 or 20 oz.
 - 16 oz are \$20; 20 oz are \$25. We keep 40% of sales.
 - We can do a custom design with Stow logo. Need to sell at least 48 of these.
 - There are dozens of designs available.
 - Each student gets a flier; orders come to us sorted and ready for delivery.
 - Lifetime guarantee.
 - Cuyahoga Falls volleyball team sold 500 (29 kids) and made \$4K.
- Cookie Dough
 - Pre-formed cookies vs. bowl of frozen dough.
 - \$16; we make 45%. Or we can have an incentive program and get 40%.
- Beef Jerky
 - \$20 we make 40%.
- Popcorn
- Laundry Soap
 - Comes in 5-gallon buckets, does 320 loads, several varieties available.
 - 100% guarantee.
 - \$45 price, we make \$13 on each one sold. Can make more at different sales levels.
- "School Band Aid"
 - First-aid kits, fully stocked.
 - \$25 each, we keep \$13.
 - Kit container can be customized but that will cut into our profits.
 - Each kit has a card with a QR code that takes you to first-aid apps.
- They can get anything we think we would want to sell.

Rain Coats

- Cristie Praeter has talked with Director of Operations Mark Fritz and Superintendent Bratton and they have said they will support our request for money for raincoats, but they can't give us a firm commitment until July 1. If we want to order the raincoats now, we will have to pay the full amount up front and wait for the reimbursement (partial) from the District. If we order the raincoats now, we will have them by fall.
- Mr. Monroe said some of the raincoats are usable, while some are really past their usefulness (the ones purchased in 1991 and 1996). He also said the uniform company is processing an order for a college band whose colors are maroon and gold and they can get our raincoats done with this order.
- Brian McCombs said we would use the money in the uniform fund.
- Lisa Toppin moved that we approve the purchase now and Beth Rieger seconded. The motion was approved.

Treasurer's Report

- The treasury activity for April was normal. There were expenses for contest and clinicians, and income from ice cream sales. We made a \$50 donation to the After Prom.
