Welcome Back

...Or WELCOME to Kimpton! I am so looking forward to working with your child, and sharing in their musical maturity this year!

Beginning of the year paperwork

In addition to a new music folder and music, all students will bring home to share with parents the Kimpton Handbook packet. This contains crucial information, including concert dates, as well as guidelines for the success of all Kimpton band students for the year. They will also receive information about purchasing a flip folder and lyre. Please take time to review this material with your child and turn in the Google Classroom Handbook acknowledgment assignment.

COLOR INSTRUMENTS

In our efforts to equalize the instrumentation of the bands, I have asked several students to consider a “color instrument.” Color instruments are instruments that are generally too expensive to purchase and are therefore owned by the band program. They contribute to the maturity of the bands sound and also help with overall balance. Students who agree to switch to a color instrument, will receive a private or group lesson with a director until a smooth transition is made. Please be patient with your student during this transition.

Step-up Instruments

As your student enters or continues middle school you may want to consider purchasing a step-up instrument. There are several reasons to think about a new instrument.

1. **Marching Band** – purchasing a second instrument would allow for the beginning instrument to be used for marching band which is generally hard on instruments.
2. **Maturity** - many beginning level instruments inhibit the student’s ability to produce a more mature sound since student line instruments are generally slightly smaller in construction than **intermediate** or **advanced** models. Most of the instruments your child started on are considered beginning level instruments. These are generally smaller in bore size (the inside diameter of the tubing) and made of cheaper materials. Step-up instruments are larger in bore and feature additional keys or valves which permit easier playing in the **high ranges often found in advancing level band music**. **Advanced level** instruments feature hand made or near hand made construction. **Many intermediate instruments are very similar to advanced or professional models but have only minor cosmetic and/or structural differences and often cost significantly less.** Please check out the information on the web page (smfband.org). First, click on Kimpton, then the “upgrading your instrument” link. If an instrument is not in the budget, perhaps upgrading your child’s mouthpiece will fit. This is a great way to get started without spending a ton of money. Please talk to a director for the most update info on mouthpieces for your child’s instrument.

Students will receive small group lessons as needed throughout the year. Students will be held accountable for material covered in this lesson. In addition to this group lesson, parents may be interested in private lessons for their student. There are three main benefits of private lessons.

| 1. One on one – teacher/student | Allows the teacher to focus all of their attention to your child’s needs. |
| 2. Catch-up | Allows the student to feel good about music on their instrument and progress with the entire class. |
| 3. Move-ahead | Allows the above average student to move ahead and tap their full musical potential. |

I recommend Woodsy’s music in Kent, Western Reserve Music, and Hudson School of Music in Hudson, or check with the directors, as we can also recommend variety of teachers for lessons as well. Many private lesson teachers are also offering virtual lessons as an option.

Is Playing a Wind Instrument Safe Right Now?

We too, have had these thoughts, concerns, and conversations since March. However, we are fortunate to have several universities complete studies that have helped answer this question. The University of Colorado continues to do the most research on this. You can watch their lengthy videos online that go into further detail. How close will my student be sitting from another student during band class?

As we all know, 6 feet is the recommended distance. In our hybrid plan, we will be able to have band classes with between 6-8 feet spacing to provide even more safety.



How do students keep their instrument clean?

This is no different than any other year. It is important to practice good maintenance and routine cleanings on your instrument. Each year, we show students the proper way to swab out and clean their instrument. However, it is more important than ever to make sure your student has the following:

All students will need to purchase and carry in their case sterilol, magic mist, or mint-t-mist for daily mouthpiece cleaning. All of these items can be purchased at any local music store (Central Instrument Company, Woodsys, Soundboard, Front Street Music, etc.) or online.



In order to keep percussion safe, percussion students will be required to use their own mallets and drumsticks for all instruments. Here is a link for two great options.

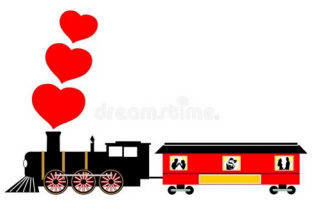
What about wearing a mask?

All students will wear a mask at all times unless playing. Percussion will wear a mask throughout the class time. The requirement and procedure is to pull the mask up and down immediately before and after playing. As seen in the video above, little to no air is released through the instrument. This is with the exception of flute players. Flute players will need to purchase a flute shield. Our high school students have used these throughout marching band season this summer and they are very effective and affordable. These can be purchased at the following website: www.fluteairshield.com.

MUSIC TESTING/ PROGRESS BOOK:

As school begins, students' testing grades will be entered into Progress Book.

The student's final grade is based on:

- **Daily Practice & Performance** **40%** (Band Honors **30%** this category & **10%** Band Honors points)
- **Participation** **20%**
- **Testing Grades:**
 - Pregame 10%
 - Show Show 10%
 - Time Outs, HOCO 10%
 - Marching Grade 10% (Gold Plan—non-marching will be exempt—can not earn nor lose points here)

Please remind your student to **attempt each piece of music**. An attempt is recorded as a 50% and will average much better than a 0%. Any piece of music not passed off or attempted receives a zero when grades are closed. Students may pass any piece of music for at least a 55% until **Thursday, October 15th**. All students have a yellow testing card with an accurate record of what has been attempted or passed. In the event a grade is missing in progress book, the yellow card will be proof that the student passed it off on time. I am in the process of updating the testing schedule based on our performances. Your student will have that information before our first performance.

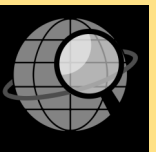
