CHAIR PLACEMENT AUDITIONS AND WINTER CONCERT

Auditions for chair placement are now complete. In regard to auditions, there will be at least one round of challenges after our December concert. Students who are not pleased with their chair placement have the opportunity to move up the section by playing a piece of music better than the person who is in front of them. Students will be made aware of their challenge piece one week in advance of their challenge. Students will play one on one with a director or a recorder. The chair placement test was the students playing grade for the first nine weeks.

All energies are now focused towards our first concert performance of the year, Thursday, December 1 at 7:30 PM in the Kimpton Gym. As usual, **ALL CONCERTS ARE MANDATORY FOR ALL STUDENTS**.

Per the handbook, **ALL** students will be wearing **black bottoms and black tops, boys with ties.** The jazz band will NOT be performing at this concert. Students will be bringing home specific information regarding arrival time, duties, etc... for this concert before Thanksgiving.

DAILY PRACTICE

All students should be taking their instruments home to practice on Monday, Wednesday and Friday unless other arrangements have been made with Mrs. Sandman. Participation points will be taken from the student grades if instruments are left in the storage room on these days. Students should practice at least 20 minutes a day 5 days a week. It is important that students practice at home to improve their skills, and to improve the music that we are preparing for the concert.

INSTRUMENT/ REED/ MOUTHPIECE UPGRADING

\$ ALL WOODWIND STUDENTS should now be playing on upgraded reeds. Rico or Juno reeds, although cheaper, are geared toward beginning instrumentalists which your child is not. My recommendations are Vandoren or Rigotti Gold for clarinets and saxophones. Please see Mrs. Sandman for purchasing quality Oboe and Bassoon reeds.

\$\$ An upgraded mouthpiece will make a HUGE difference in an instrumentalist's tone. Please see our website for a list of upgraded mouthpieces

\$\$\$ For three to four years, your student has worked to develop their skills on a musical instrument. As they continue at middle school and look ahead to high school, now is a great time to consider purchasing a step-up instrument. There are several reasons to think about a new instrument.

- First, marching band is hard on instruments. The daily use in the elements can cause an instrument to show signs of wear much faster than when were just used in concert band. A new horn would allow your student to use their beginning instrument for marching band and their new step-up instrument for concert band.
- Secondly, many beginning level instruments inhibit the student's ability to produce a more mature sound since student-line instruments are generally slightly smaller in construction than intermediate or advanced models. Most of the instruments your child started on are considered beginning level instruments. These are generally smaller in bore size (the inside diameter of the tubing) and utilize cheaper materials. Step-up instruments are larger in bore and feature additional keys or valves which permit easier playing in the high ranges often found in middle school and high school level band music. In the case of clarinets, they are made from wood, producing a warmer, richer sound. Advanced level instruments feature handmade or near handmade construction and adjustment. Many intermediate instruments are very similar to advanced or professional models but have only minor cosmetic and/or slight structural differences.

The bottom line is, your child is no longer a beginner and they should not be playing on a beginning level instrument. Please feel free to visit the band website and investigate our instrument upgrade suggestions. Contact a director if you have specific questions.

Upgrading Your Student's Instrument

JAZZ BAND

Students who play trumpet, trombone or saxophone have received information regarding jazz band if their chair placement audition met the necessary criteria. –CONGRATULATIONS! Rhythm section auditions will occur on Monday, October 17th after school. Our first rehearsal is scheduled for Wednesday, October 19th from 2:50 to 4:15. We are looking forward to our first concert in January!

COLOR INSTRUMENTS

In our efforts to equalize the instrumentation of the bands, I have asked several students to consider a "color instrument." Color instruments are instruments that are generally too expensive to purchase, and are therefore owned by the band program. Students who have agreed to switch to a color instrument have been receiving a private or group lesson with a director with a goal of a smooth transition back into concert band.





Concert Bands

As marching band season wraps up, students transition to concert bands. Ever wondered what the difference is between the concert bands?

Freshman Concert Band

The Freshman Concert Band students will be placed on the same audition upperclassmen band perform and are placed in chairs based on their score.

Maroon and Gold Symphonic Bands

The Gold and Maroon Symphonic Bands are designed as a mid to upper level high school performing ensembles. The class size is between 60-80 students. These ensembles compete in OMEA Adjudicated Events in class A or B.

The intention through the audition, is both Gold and Maroon bands will be equal in performing level. With that in mind, both bands will be balanced with the same instrumentation

SMFHS Wind Ensemble

The Wind Ensemble is the highest level performing ensemble at SMFHS. Students perform musical selections usually reserved advanced high school and college level ensembles.

This ensemble is considered the honors level class of the band department with 55-70 students.

The Wind Ensemble competes in OMEA Adjudicated Events in class AA and was selected to perform at the OMEA State Professional Convention in 2000, The Ohio American School Band Directors Association Ohio Convention in 2005 and the Ohio Band Director's Conference Hall Of Fame in 2008. The Wind Ensemble has also been asked to perform with bands from Kent State University and the University of Akron.
